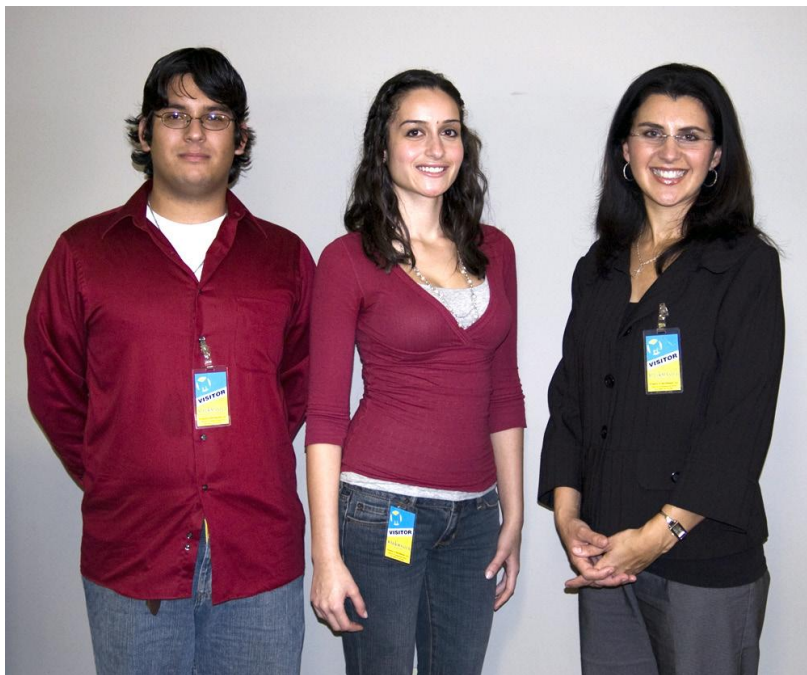


# MarkMaster's 2010 Latino Scholarship Winners:

## ABOUT THE USF LATINO SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The USF Latino Scholarship is a university-wide scholarship program designed to achieve and sustain the educational benefits of diversity while increasing the number of students interested in issues affecting the Latino community and/or likely to give back to the Latino community after graduation.

Students participating in the Latino Scholarship program must meet the minimum GPA requirements and maintain this throughout their studies while at USF. Preference is also given to students who are first in their families to attend college (First-Generation students).
